

**Bucksport** 

## 270A: Bucksport peat, 0 to 2 percent slopes

The Bucksport component makes up 78 percent of the map unit. Slopes are 0 to 2 percent. This component is on hills on glaciated uplands, mountains on glaciated uplands. The parent material consists of peaty herbaceous organic material over mucky herbaceous organic material and/or mucky woody organic material. Depth to a root restrictive layer is greater than 60 inches. The natural drainage class is very poorly drained. Water movement in the most restrictive layer is moderately high. Available water to a depth of 60 inches (or restricted depth) is very high. Shrink-swell potential is low. This soil is not flooded. It is frequently ponded. A seasonal zone of water saturation is at 0 inches during January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, December. Organic matter content in the surface horizon is about 90 percent. Nonirrigated land capability classification is 5w. This soil meets hydric criteria.

Pond reservoir areas:

This unit is generally not suited as a site for soil-based residential wastewater disposal systems, based on a review by the Natural Resources Conservation Service of criteria set forth in the Vermont 2007 Environmental Protection Rules. Excessive soil wetness in association with the minimal slope is the limiting condition. Prolonged periods of saturation at or near the soil surface do not allow for the proper functioning of septic systems.
